

## Voting and Membership Guidelines

The boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward referred to below are defined in Article V of the Articles of Incorporation of the Old Sixth Ward Neighborhood Association dated October 11, 1991 "The Old Sixth Ward neighborhood is defined as bounded by Houston Avenue on the east, Memorial Drive on the south, Glenwood Cemetery on the west, and the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks immediately north of Center Street on the north."

According to Article XVII Section 31 of the Old Sixth Ward Neighborhood Association bylaws "No individual trustee, fiduciary, business entity, corporation, or nuclear family residing in one residence shall have more than one (1) vote. No multiple residence unit buildings shall have more than four (4) votes. Any request for variance or dispute shall be referred to the Board of Directors for final decision. (as amended, January 1992)

The following was adopted by the Old Sixth Ward Neighborhood Association on January 21, 2019:

You must meet one of the following criteria in order to be a member of the Old Sixth Ward Neighborhood Association:

1. An Individual who owns 1 or more properties within the boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward and lives in one of those properties. This member will have one vote.
2. An Individual who lives within the boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward as a tenant in a single family unit. This member will have one vote.
3. An Individual who lives in a multi-family unit (2 or more living units on the same lot) within the boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward (NOTE: No more than 4 individuals per multi-family unit may be members). It will be the responsibility of the residents to determine who will be the representatives and those persons, individually, will be responsible for filling out a membership request form and paying the annual dues. Each member will have one vote.
4. A business entity that operates a physical business or owns property within the boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward. This member will have one vote.

Amended on January 28, 2019 to include:

An individual who owns property within the boundaries of the Old Sixth Ward will have one vote.
